12/23 Welcome & Apologies

Cllr Marcovitch welcomed Councillors and members of the public to the meeting. Apologies were accepted from Cllr Ker.

13/23 Declaration of Interest

Cllr Colbert declared an interest in relation to the quotes being requested for leaf collection in Wroxton

14/23 Minutes of Meeting on 9 January 2023

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 9 January 2023 were agreed.

15/23 Matters Arising

None. All action points completed since the last meeting.

16/23 Public Forum

A resident of Wroxton gave his support to the Laurels Farm application. He believes the application will improve road safety and is in favour of the potential to add a car park at the school. The Parish Council advised that they also support the application with caveats regarding access to the gate locking system and responsibility for maintaining the road surface from the North Newington Road.

17/23 Finance

Bank Reconciliation

This was agreed.

Proposed Allocations

Cllr Robarts presented the allocations for 2023/24. These were discussed and agreed. The allocations contain £1000.00 for each village hall, whose treasurers will be advised accordingly. There is also an allocation for 2 new speed cameras, in the sum of 6000.00.

NALC Salary Review

The new pay scales have been published and the Clerk's wages have been increased to £13.21 per hour, backdated to 1 April 2022.

18/23 Council Business Decision & Discussions

a) Decisions:-

Leaf collection (Wroxton)

Thomas Fox are increasing their charges from £240 + vat to £252+ vat per ½ day. Councillors considered that the last leaf collection was not completed satisfactorily at first and Thomas Fox had to be recalled to complete the work. Cllr Colbert suggested that leaves should be collected when they are dry, rather than waiting until they are wet, which makes them very slippery and harder to remove. This may mean having more than one leaf collection per year. It was agreed that the Clerk should obtain 3 quotes for a dry leaf collection, including from Faye Eldridge.

b) Discussion:

Update on King's Coronation Celebrations.

Cherwell District Council are offering a grant of £500 to the two villages. There are conditions attached to claiming the grant. Balscote Village Hall are hiring a bouncy castle and marquee and will be allocated £220 of the grant. £280 will be offered to Wroxton for their planned activities. Cllr Colbert will discuss this with Chris May as there are plans to hold a picnic event within Wroxton College grounds.

Update on Speed Camera socket in Church Street

Cllr Robarts has contacted Dave Catlin at OCC regarding installing a socket for a speed camera in Church Street. He is waiting for a response and will update the Parish Council when he has more information.

Update on legal matters re Speed Detector

The Court has granted permission for the Parish Council to put a second charge on SG Manufacturing's property to assist it in reclaiming the monies owed as ordered by the Court. The existence of a charge should prevent sale or transfer of the property which appears to be the company's most significant asset. S G Manufacturing have only just been notified of this charge and are being given 14 days to apply to have the decision reconsidered. Cllr Robarts will continue to monitor and press for recovery of the amount owed

Speed Limit on A422 approaching Wroxton

Another accident has occurred on the A422. The recent data downloaded from the speed cameras has shown that speeding through the village has increased. It has previously been suggested that the 30mph sign at the Stratford entrance of the village be moved back to slow vehicles down when entering the village. It was agreed that ClIr. Marcovitch will send a letter to express residents' concerns, supported by the speeding data collected in February.. ClIr Marcovitch to write to OCC

Memorial Bench

Andrew Shenton is preparing the bench. It will need to be installed on a concrete base. **Clir Marcovitch will arrange for this to be done when the bench is ready.**

Salt Bins

The Parish Council are waiting to take delivery of the salt for the new housing erected at the Village Hall.

Wroxton Pond Railings

The broken railings around the pond have been repaired and the invoice settled.

Telecoms Pole by Wroxton Pond

Five telegraph poles have been erected in Wroxton to support a fibre cable network. One has been insensitively sited by the pond. Unfortunately these works were not required to submit to planning procedures and the PC were not consultees, although the Chairman did make representations to Cllr Webb (CDC) regarding our concerns.

Telecoms Mast Lease

The Parish Council is awaiting contact from Cellnex to renegotiate the expired lease. Fisher German has been appointed to represent the Parish Council in those negotiations. **Cllr Robarts will continue to monitor**

Sports Club Pavillion Update

The Sports Club has now paid their contribution towards the Parish Council's Public Liability Insurance liability.

19/23 Clerk Update

Cemetery Bin, Sanctuary Land & Ragwort Complaint, Pensions Enrolment

The Clerk has renewed the Brown Bin licence for the Cemetery at a cost of £39.00. She has also arranged for a new green bin to be delivered to the Cemetery, free of charge. The work on clearing up the Sanctuary owned land in Balscote has not started despite promises given previously. The Clerk will chase this up. Sanctuary has completed work on the garden of 13 The Firs, Wroxton in respect of the ragwort complaint, but the property is still unoccupied. Cllr Marcovitch has completed the Pension Form; Cllr Colbert will supervise Wroxton's clean-up and Bob Jesson had previously volunteered to liaise in Balscote.. The new dog waste bin has been installed in Wroxton, free of charge, near the school . The Clerk will add it to the emptying schedule.
