

RULES

1. Please register your entry and pay the fee between 6.00pm and 7.00pm on Thursday, 1st September.
2. Exhibits can be staged between 8.30 am and 10.30 am on the day, Sunday, 4th September.
3. The hall will be cleared by 11.00 am on the day for judging.
4. Prizes will be awarded at Judge's discretion.
5. Open for viewing at 2.00 pm
6. Winners will be announced and prizes presented at 3.00 pm
7. Uncollected exhibits will be sold immediately following the presentations.
8. Tables must be cleared by 3.30 pm
9. The Committee cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to any exhibit or equipment.

RULES FOR SHOWING

1. "As Grown" means the product to be washed, not scrubbed and not trimmed.
2. Dressed onions and exhibition shallots – take off 1-2 skins, tops trimmed folded down and tied with raffia or string and roots trimmed back to base
3. All classes – generally try to display items that are uniform in size.
4. Floral Art – drapes and accessories can be used.
